What's been happening lately?

It has been a busy term with lots of new developments at Talking Matters. Keira is enjoying some time at home with her new baby Harper Maddison. Jessica took 6 weeks leave to travel Europe and is back in week 2 of term 3. Judy joined Jodie and Mandy in the front office and has settled in well to her new role with us.

Meg Redway is our newest speech pathologist and has settled in well. She began her time with us filling in for Jess while she is away so children could have continued services. From term 3 Meg will be providing school based services to a number of Playford Primary School students as well as seeing clients in the office. Meg is also experienced in working with adults with speech pathology needs.

From term 3 Joanne will be providing services on a weekly basis at Tanunda primary school in the special unit as well as doing a few school visits in the Barossa Valley area. Joanne will also continue to see children on a Wednesday from the Kapunda hospital. With some of her office children now being seen at school she now has vacancies for children at Kapunda. We have had a growth in the number of public schools we are now visiting to work with children. This is possible where we have a cluster of 3 or more families requiring services and where the school has the space and is happy to work with us. The team have also been very busy attending or preparing to attend upcoming professional training sessions. Topics covered include PECS, teaching and behavior support for children on the autism spectrum and upcoming events with Sue Larkey and Barry Prizant on the SCERTS model of intervention. We have been working towards incorporating our new learning in our practice which has been exciting.

Final placement speech pathology students

Next term we will be hosting 2 student speech pathologists for their very last practical placement before graduating as speech pathologists. As speech pathologists our professional responsibilities include teaching and supporting new speech pathologists to ensure they are competent professionals as they enter the work force. We also gain a lot from the process ourselves as we carefully examine our own skills and develop and consolidate our own understandings as we impart knowledge to others. All of this reflection and learning helps us to keep up to date and ensure that we are constantly improving on the services we offer our clients.

Emma Ho and Kristen Brown will start a 3 day a week, 13 week placement with the Talking Matters team from week 2 of the term. They will be developing their skills in providing individual therapy, assessment, planning and programming as well as some group sessions within schools. Some of our clients will be offered the opportunity to work with the students. All sessions will be monitored by the senior speech pathologists, giving these children the benefit of 2 speech pathologists working together to assist them.

Families will be asked if they are happy to have a student involved in sessions. As always our first priority lies with children and their families and students will only be involved with sessions when parents are completely happy for this to occur.
